The Law

The foremost component is the National Law called the "Children (Education and Care Services National Law Application) Act 2010". This Law regulates education and care services for children.

• The Regulations

The way that this law is applied is detailed in the "Education and Care Services National Amendment Regulations" May 2024. These regulations are the practical details and rules under the law. The Regulations set out the minimum operational requirements organised around the following Quality Areas of the National Quality Standards

- 1. Educational program and practice
- 2. Relationships with children
- 3. Children's health and safety
- 4. Collaborative partnerships with families and communities
- 5. Physical Environment
- 6. Staffing Arrangements
- 7. Governance and Leadership

• The Early Years Learning Framework Version 2

The approved early years learning framework for preschools in NSW is the Early Years Learning Framework called *Belonging*, *Being & Becoming*. This document is generally referred to as the EYLF. The aim of the EYLF is to extend and enrich children's learning from birth to 5 years and through the transition to school.



Preschool Governance - Roles

Regulatory Authority – NSW Department of Education and Community

The NSW Department of Education and Community have the primary responsibility for the approval, monitoring and quality assessment of services in accordance with the National legislative framework.

National Body – The Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority

The National Body is jointly governed by the Federal Government and State and Territory Governments to oversee the new system

Approved Provider – Management Committee

East Lismore Community Preschool is a not-for-profit incorporated association. This means that the preschool has a management committee (consisting of parents and community members) and any profits made by the preschool are returned back into the service.

The Management Committee is responsible for supporting effective leadership and management of the service that contributes to quality environments for children's learning and development. It is also responsible for the Governance that supports the operation of a quality service. They determine the service's vision and purpose, appoint the Director, ensure compliance with legal obligations, and ensure the ongoing financial viability of the service.

The Management Committee operates under the NSW Associations Incorporation Act 2009, and the Model Constitution. All parents are welcome and encouraged to be part of our preschool's management committee. You can become an ordinary member or an executive member. Committee members are elected each year at the annual general meeting. The Committee meets on the first Tuesday of every month.

Responsible Person

The National Law requires approved providers to always ensure that the service is educating and caring for children, there is an approved responsible person present at the preschool. The name of the Responsible Person at any time can be found displayed on the preschool wall and in OWNA.

Our Preschool History

East Lismore Community Preschool first began in 1967 at St Stephen's Presbyterian Church in East Lismore. It was privately owned until 1982 when it became a not-for-profit community-owned Preschool. In 1988, the Preschool was built at 24 Colleen Place East Lismore, – a purpose-built two-room centre. Unfortunately, due to the February 2022 flood we are located at Wyrallah Road Public School, where we will stay until our preschool is ready for our return.

Enrolment Groups

Our Preschool supports the NSW Department of Education and Community's commitment to providing 600 hours of early education for all children. All preschool enrolments are based on 2 day groups – this may change in 2026. We are awaiting the funding guidelines for 2026 to know how many days children will be able to access at a fee relief rate. We have a flexible approach to ensure that we meet the needs of our families.





Our Rooms are called the Wattle Room and The Lilly Pilly room.



Our Program — Slow Pedagogy



Our Preschool supports the principles and outcomes of the Early Years Learning Framework. Families will see references to this framework in our program and documentation.

The Framework outcomes are

- 1. Children have a strong sense of identity
- 2. Children are connected with and contribute to their world
- 3. Children have a strong sense of wellbeing
- 4. Children are confident and involved learners
- 5. Children are effective communicators

Preschool Policies

Our preschool policies can be accessed on our website or our OWNA app if you are enrolled. Our policies set the values for our preschool and are displayed in the preschool room. We encourage families to read and refer to these policies anytime. If you have any questions about our policies, please speak to the Director.

What to bring to Preschool

A bag – that is easily opened and closed.

A labelled drink bottle of water – to place on the drink trolley in the preschool room.





A change of clothes (or two!) – in case of accidents or messy play. Please label all items and do not send clothing that can't risk paint stains.

A wet/dirty clothes bag – A wet bag will be given to each child at enrolment.

A healthy packed lunch box - e.g. Sandwiches, wraps, salad, yoghurt. We encourage low-rubbish lunchboxes and ask that you try to avoid foods such as chocolates, lollies, and chips, we consider this home food. Please label all containers.



Our lunchbox tips!

- Keep it simple small serves and not too many choices.
- Ensure foods can be opened and eaten easily.
- Avoid packing a 'sometimes' food every day.
- If you choose healthy foods, don't worry if your child wants the same foods every day.
- Limit food wrapping for sustainability practices.

What not to bring to Preschool.

Toys, books, jewellery, and special items from home are not required at preschool. Our preschool program will keep all children fully engaged throughout the preschool day and items from home often cause conflict between children because they are special to your child. Please be aware we are not responsible for any items sent to preschool however, we work hard with your child to learn how to take responsibility for their belongings.



When You Arrive




Please let us know you and your child are here, help your child to place their bag in their locker and their drink bottle in the bottle esky, morning tea in the morning tea esky. Please sign your child in on the room via the iPad using the OWNA app. Convey any messages to the staff that may be important for your child's day at preschool. e.g. If they had a bad night's sleep, need medication, any family changes or any changes to the usual departure routine. We welcome families attending when it suits your family. However, there are also key group times in our routine and request if you are arriving after 9 am regularly that you work within the room routine, so your child doesn't feel left out, and others are not interrupted. E.g., coming after morning circle supports the room and talks with the Early Childhood Teacher about what works best for the classroom and your family.

When You Leave

Please let us know that you're here and encourage your child to gather their belongings including a bag, lunch box and drink bottle. Please check your children's pockets for any toys and sign your child out via OWNA. Feel free to stay for a chat and catch up about your child's day and what's coming up in the future for your child.

Partnering with Families

Know what's happening....

On commencement of enrolment, you will receive an email invite to accept and download the app OWNA for enrolment, signing your child in and fees. There are many ways to keep up with what's happening at preschool, via emails, Facebook and Instagram posts, and Learning Journals or staying for a catch-up to discuss your child's development.





Parent/Teacher meetings....

Parent/Teacher meetings are offered mid-year as a way of touching base with you and discussing important areas of your child's development. It is a wonderful opportunity to discuss how your child is going at preschool, any concerns or worries you may have and transition to school/returning to preschool options for the following year. Of course, if you would like to speak with your child's teacher outside this mid-year opportunity, please don't hesitate to contact us and we can arrange a suitable time. We may also reach out and ask for a family meeting to help set some shared goals, so we work with you in collaboration.

Fundraising....



The committee run regular fundraising activities to help provide essential funds for our preschool. The committee welcomes ideas and help with fundraising activities. If this is something, you would like to help with please let us know.



Partnering with Families

Preschool requires that parents of enrolled children behave in a manner consistent with decency, courtesy, and respect at all times. One of our aims is to provide an appropriate and secure environment for children that encourages growth, learning and development. Achieving this environment is the responsibility of employees, committee members and parents or adults who enter the school.

We are a close family-like community, and the preschool is aware that staff and parents have relationships outside of the classroom setting. We may also be in regular attendance at shared community events. It is important for any personal conflicts or disagreements to be kept outside of the preschool. The preschool shall always be a calm and positive place for children. Any concerns a parent may have regarding a member of staff will be listened to outside of the classroom and where needed acted upon. However, it is both the parent's and the staff member's responsibility to ensure that personal disagreements must be kept outside of the classroom setting. For more information, please read out parent code of conduct.



Excursions....



We welcome families to partner with our preschool by joining in our classrooms. Maybe you would like to read a book to the children or create and play. Maybe you have a special interest you would like to share with the children. If you would like to come and be a part of our classroom please speak to one of the teachers.

Each year we enjoy various incursions and excursions at our preschool. Each excursion will have a permission note with specific details about the excursion. For each excursion, we will also perform a risk assessment that is available to families on request. On some excursions, we welcome parents to join us, if you are able to help please let us know on the permission note.

Feedback & suggestions....

We welcome any feedback and suggestions about our preschool. You can discuss these with a teacher or approach the Director if preferred. You may also write directly to the Preschool management committee. Another option is to complete a feedback/complaint form. All communication will be kept confidential and managed unbiasedly and with gentleness.

Sun Safety

Hats

Educators, staff, and children are required to wear sun-safe hats that protect their face, neck, and ears. Upon enrolment, all children receive a preschool hat that is kept at the preschool.





Clothing

When outdoors, educators, staff and children will wear sun-safe clothing that covers as much of the skin (especially the shoulders) as possible. Upon enrolment, all children receive a preschool shirt that can be used which provides sun protection. Extra shirts are available for purchase for \$15.

Sunscreen

When you arrive, please apply sunscreen to your child in the warmer months. Staff will support children to top up sunscreen, SPF 30 or higher. If your children have any known allergies or reactions to sunscreen, please advise us at the time of enrolment.



Birthday Celebrations

We enjoy celebrating children's birthdays at preschool. Families are welcome to bring in a birthday cake to share on their child's special day. A slab cake or cupcakes are a good option for easy handling and distribution.

If your child has any food restrictions (e.g., allergies), it would be helpful if you could supply some appropriate substitutes for us to keep in the freezer.







2026 Preschool Enrolment and Fees

There is a non-refundable \$25 enrolment fee for each child at their commencement at Preschool, if this is not paid, your child's place cannot be held. Fees and Enrolment paperwork are required prior to commencing.

There is a clothing fee of \$20, which contributes towards the cost of an ELCP T-shirt, hat, and wet bags that your child gets to keep. This is also required prior to commencement.

A \$50 per child building levy fee will be applied in 2026. This will be payable in your OWNA account after your child's first day.

Extended hour fees are \$5 per 15 minutes past 3:30 pm. Please make sure you sign your child out via OWNA so there are no incorrect fees allocated to your account.

NSW Department of Education has been offering Affordable Preschool fee relief to all children attending preschool. If you wish to nominate us as your preschool for fee relief, please sign and return the fee relief declaration form. This can only be used at one preschool. If you chose not to opt-in at ELCP your fees are below. For more information on this initiative please go to the website below. This initiative may be different in 2026.

The Priority of Access Guidelines followed by state-funded preschools is defined by NSW State Government funding Agreements. In no particular order, these are:

- · Children who are at risk of harm
- · Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children
- · Children from low-income families
- · Children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds
- · Children with disabilities
- · Children in their year before school.



We know at times everyone can experience tough times, you may email the Preschool Committee and ask to be considered for fee exemption that will be given to those with evidence of hardship. Please email the committee at Committee@eastlismorepreschool.com

Fee Payment Options

Deposit due upon letters of offer. Bank details will be sent with the letter of offer. Invoices will be sent to families once a fortnight per term time. If you wish to move Preschools part way through the year, we require a minimum of two weeks' notice before fees will stop being charged. We currently offer Direct Debit options through the OWNA app. or you can set up automatic payments with your banking app. if you wish to pay each week or fortnight.

Immunisation

It is a requirement of the preschool that all children who attend provide the preschool with an Australian Immunisation Register History Statement (that shows 'up to date' or 'cannot be immunised for medical reasons) – see example, or an Australian Immunisation Register Immunisation History Form (that shows a child is on a recognised catch-up schedule).

The Preschool is required to maintain updated and current immunisation status history statements. If a scheduled immunisation takes place during your child's enrolment, please provide the preschool with the updated immunisation statement.



Sickness

It is the preschool policy that a child may not attend preschool if they are unwell. Children who have been unwell in the 24 hours prior to a preschool day must stay at home. This includes cases of diarrhoea, vomiting, conjunctivitis, school sores, Ringworm or colds and flu. Anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 and has symptoms must remain at home and not enter the preschool until symptom-free.



If your child becomes unwell during the day at preschool, we will ring and ask you to collect your child. Please make sure your emergency contacts are local so someone can attend in a timely manner to support your children and reduce cross-contamination with other people.

Medication

Please ensure all medication is handed to teachers to be stored correctly as per our medication policy. No medication of any kind is to be left in a child's bag.

We ask that when children start taking mood altering medications such as Ritalin. Due to their age they have a reduced capacity to verbalise their experiences of the changes they are feeling, we ask this is started at home on a weekend or school holiday.

Please note if the medication is required to be crushed to be taken, this must also come with a letter or on the prescription label as we are unable to change the medication unless it is documented. We cannot vary the time we give medication to children if it is written on the label or letter from the doctor. E.g. the child awoke late and you gave them their morning dose at 8 am rather than 7 am, which would mean the lunch dose would need to be later, if the label states a time then we must administer it as per the label

If your child requires medication to be administered by Educators at the preschool during preschool attendance, it can only be administered if

- There is a signed medication form every day that the medicine is required
- It is prescribed by a registered medical practitioner, with instructions either attached to the medication, or in written form from the medical practitioner
- It is in the original container
- The original label clearly shows the name of the child
- The medication is before the expiry/use-by date
- The time it was last administered



We welcome your family to our preschool community and look forward to partnering together to enable your child to develop a readiness for the transition to school, and a readiness for life.
